He loves the morning activities even though he forgets them the minute he returns home. Never mind – it's the moment that counts. Everyone in the High Street seems to know him as well as all his **Care Shop** Friends. Truly he's living the Selsey dream.

Later Life Matters

One thing that is certain is we know we will die one day. Living with a life limiting condition or cancer diagnosis may bring that date a little earlier and, knowing that, may affect us in a number of ways, but one way or another, we do need to face it. Emotionally,



mentally and physically this can make us feel daunted, scared and panicked. We can go into 'fight or flight' mode.

The **Selsey Community Forum** has several services that can guide you through our later life years, bringing an element of control back into your life. You will never be or feel alone.

We can provide Buddies to support you through the

My Future Care Handbook and this gives you an opportunity to prioritise areas that you need to focus on. It also ensures that you are up to date with what needs to be put in place. For example:



- ✓ Will
- ✔ Power of Attorney (POA)
- ✓ Advanced Care Planning
- ✔ Respect Document
- ✔ Bucket List
- ✓ Funeral/cremation preferences and service

Our **Money Support Services** can offer guidance with your changing needs. This can include assessing your income and expenditure to manage bills; seeking entitlements such as **Attendance Allowance** to pay for some of your care needs and includes the **SR1** form if prognosis is less than 1 year; support with mobility with a **Blue Badge** application and access to temporary independent living aids.

Buddy Assisted Transport Service provides support when attending medical appointments and treatment.

We can support your **Health and Social Care** referral which assesses your changing needs and those of your carer. We can also help you access **Housing Support** including **Occupational Therapy** referrals and **Housing Benefit**.

Our **Robins Service** offers someone with a life limiting condition or terminal diagnosis befriending support through careful assessment -

- ✓ Navigating through the complexities of the health care pathway
- ✓ Ensuring links with local hospice support and hospice at home service through **ECHO** (End of Life Care Hub)
- ✓ Spiritual and emotional support
- ✔ Befriending service from our Robins volunteers
- Ongoing counselling as required for the individual and their family
- Responding to religious needs by accessing faith representatives
- ✔ Bereavement support to family, friends and work colleagues

Our involvement with each person is individual. **Selsey Community Forum** has **Hubs** available throughout the **Chichester District** including St Wilfrid's Hospice, the Witterings and Selsey Medical Practices. You can call the **Care Shop** for any of the services mentioned above, and you will be referred to one of the service leads.

The **End-of-Life Network** is developing in the Chichester and Coastal area and the **Selsey Community Forum** is pleased to be involved with other local agencies. The purpose is for people to



become better informed, better supported and good training is provided to care staff working in **Care Homes** and **Care at Home Organisations**. Opportunities to attend public information sessions with guest speakers and have some interesting conversations, and presentations will come in due course. We will keep you posted. The website is a

Selsey Tramway Exhibition

The fascinating but ill-fated story of Selsey



Tramway is featured in a free exhibition at the **Novium Museum** until 31st March. The exhibition recounts how a railway line was proposed to link the then remote and

isolated village of Selsey with Chichester. By August 1897, the Selsey Tramway was born, operated by The Hundred of Manhood and Selsey Tramway Company.

The line linked the outlying villages south of Chichester with approximately seven-and-a-half miles of track and 11 stops in total.

On 27th August 1897, the tramway was officially opened at the Chichester station, while the Selsey station was still under construction. Crowds were disappointed when the first train arrived an hour late, setting the standard for the rest of its run. The tramway was possibly the most problematic railway of the area. Although, in 1916, annual passenger numbers peaked at 105.169.

By the 1930s, bus services were more reliable and after thirty-eight years of operation, the tramway's last service ran on 19th January 1935.



Chichester Cathedral

2025 marks the 950th anniversary of the formation of the diocese of Chichester and Chichester

Cathedral. The monastery founded by St Wilfrid in 681 in Selsey was the first Cathedral in Sussex.

However, following the Norman Conquest of 1066, it was deemed by the

Council of London that Cathedrals situated in remote locations should be moved to more populous areas and so, in 1075 the seat of the Bishop of Selsey was moved to the settlement of Chichester, then Noviomagus.

The See of Chichester was established, and the construction of the new Cathedral began using stone from the Isle of Wight and was overseen by Stigand, the first Norman Bishop. The Cathedral was eventually completed by Bishop Ralph Luffa and consecrated in 1108. To celebrate, a diverse programme of events is taking place; check it out at www.chichestercathedral.org.uk/

Selsey Common The Number

We thought you might like to see some of our numbers. These are just the ones that are we can quantify as so much of our work is about guidance, support, information and advice. Up until the end of June this year there have been **4,553** people visiting **Selsey Care Shop**, with



4,228 calls made into the **Care Shop** and **2,455** calls being made out – that's an amazing **11,256** contacts made in just 6 months! The statistics for the whole of 2024 show **8,183** face-to-face



interactions, with 8,296 calls in and 4,808 calls out, giving a total of 21,287 contacts made in that year - so as you can see, we are on track to exceed that huge number this year.

We could not do any of this without the governance of our Board of 12 Trustees, the leadership of our infallible Chair, Mike Nicholls, the unstinting hard work of our 13 staff and the substantial time, experience and skills provided by our 200 volunteers, as well as the generous donations and funding from individuals, businesses, local organisations and national funders.

Impact of Our Help

Below are 2 case studies of people in our community whom we have been able to help. As you can

see, the support and service we offer is diverse, necessary and appreciated.



Case Study 1

ST is a regular visitor to the Care Shop. Her husband has impaired cognitive function, and they have no family close by, so she relies on our support. ST has had many issues and struggles with her husband's decline in health. We supported them with a doctor's visit to get an assessment of her husband to further investigate his cognitive decline. They are vulnerable residents in Selsey because of their health and frailty. Their landline and broadband had completely stopped working and we were able to refer them to CASPS (Computer and Smartphone Service), a service that we offer to those in our community with any IT related issues. Our valuable volunteers who have significant experience with IT, happily visit to support with any problems. One volunteer attended and was told of a two week wait with Sky because of a backlog, and that there wasn't a welfare department. The volunteer later that day spoke to a friend who confirmed that there was in fact a department for welfare and



high-risk individuals. We then supported with a call to SKY with ST present, told of their situation and need for a working landline, and within 24 hours the issue was fixed.

Later in the week ST received a water bill for the next 12 months. ST and her husband are on pension credit with little to no savings. As we all know water bills have risen significantly this year putting many into financial hardship. From the Care Shop we called Southern Water. After explaining the situation ST was placed onto a social tariff, reducing her monthly payments by almost half. They also added them to the priority services register. Support has also been offered to ST with the loan of a 4-wheeled walker due to mobility problems, provision of urinary pads, liaised with her local Rental Agency due to concerns with them attending unannounced and supported in getting a cheaper deal on their car insurance.

Case Study 2

On a busy day in the Care Shop a lady came into the shop in distress. JW had just been to a solicitor's following her grandfather's death



with whom she had lived. JW had no money and was starting a new job the next day locally. JW had no access to heat as she was unable to add pound coins to her electricity meter, or afford gas to heat the caravan that she is living in. We were able on that day to provide a small amount of money to add to her electricity meter, gave a £10.00 Co-Op card to access emergency food, a foodbank voucher was requested for Friday that week and delivered to her home. A referral was made to the Household

Support fund for support with energy including the purchasing of gas bottles, and a referral to Better Housing Better Health for ongoing energy support. A money support appointment was made to see what other benefits JW was entitled to as she will be living on a small income. All of this was put into place in the space of one hour. JW was so grateful.
